The PUD has been recognized by the Employment Security Department's (ESD) YesVets Program for hiring U.S. military veterans into its workforce for the fourth year in a row. **YesVets is a Veteran Hiring** Campaign that began in 2016 and encourages and recognizes employers who show their commitment to veteran employment. The PUD received the YesVets Employer of the Year Award in 2020 and has been nominated for the award again this year. Over ten percent (10%) of the PUD's workforce is comprised of veterans from all branches of the military.

Qualified Pend Oreille PUD customers, based on their total annual household income and the age of the applicant, may receive a \$5 monthly discount on their utility bill. An application, age verification and income verification are required to receive the monthly discount. Customers will be required to re-verify eligibility upon request. When used properly, portable and standby generators are a great option to provide backup power during brownouts or blackouts. Learn how to use generators safely with the following tips:


Never operate a generator in an enclosed space





Always use grounded cords and inspect cords for damage prior to use

Always use GFCI protection



Make sure to start / stop generators when no electrical loads are connected



Keep generators dry, do not operate when wet, and refuel when cool



Do not overload generators



Do not plug a generator directly into your home, connect items being powered directly to the generator

TRANSFER SWITCHES



Transfer switches, whether manual or automatic, allow you to choose between utility power or backup generator power



Transfer switches are the only way to safely power your home's electrical system



Using a transfer switch prevents backfeeding. This occurs when your generator becomes a power source for the surrounding area and can damage your home, your neighbor's homes, and injure workers trying to restore power

DO YOU HAVE OR ARE YOU **CONSIDERING A GENERATOR?**

Portable generators are an important tool for many ■ Pend Oreille County residents when the power goes out, but if not used right, they pose an extreme danger for your family, your neighbors, and our PUD line crews.

Generators can keep critical parts of your home going during a power outage and can be helpful during storm season, especially in rural areas where power outages can last longer.

Please refer to the safety guidelines outlined here and if you are installing a new generator, please consult a licensed electrician and be sure and follow permit and Washington State Labor and Industries guidelines.

Make sure your home has carbon monoxide alarms outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home






